When the Peru left Manila there were fifteen hundred sick among the men, and the physicians were terribly dismayed at the progress smallpox was making.

According to Palmer, in one day there were ten deaths from smallpox. Captain Linn said that he knew of but five deaths from that disease in a single day. The filth poured into the canals by the Chinese was said to be a prolific source of disease.

BUBONIC PLAGUE IN VIENNA.

Six Cases in the City-All Hospital

Washington, Nov. 2.—The marine nospital service has received through the State Department a despatch from U.S. Consul-General Hurst at Vienna, stat-S. Consul-General Hurst at Vienna, stating that three deaths have occurred from bubonic plague, and that there are now only six cases in the entire city, and these are all hospital attendants. Mr. Hurst adds that the infection of immigrants is improbable. Dr. Wyman, surgeon-general of the Marine Hospital service, says that no unusual delays to the landing at New York of immigrants from Austria-Hungary are contemplated. The consul at the ports of departure will examine each immigrant before he is allowed to go aboard ship, and if he comes from the infected district his baggage will be disinfected and every other precaution taken to prevent the spread of disease.


