ENGINEER AND AIDE NAMED

Fire and Water Committee Give the Positions to J. Boyd and J. Robert Boyd.

CITIZEN'S CLAIMS REPORTED AGAINST

Eight Hundred Tons of coal Will Be Kept in Reserve for Pumping House.

Hamilton, March 5.—The Fire and Water Committee met this evening and transacted considerable business. J. Boyd and J. Robert Boyd were appointed engineer and assistant engineer respectively of the high level pumping house. The sub-committee on the insurance of firemen presented a scheme for insurance of each for \$1000, with special provisions for accidents. After some discussion the plan did not find favor with the committee, and was referred back.

Report Against Claim.

The sub-committee that had under consideration the claims of E. C. Pearnside and G. J. Rayner for damages for loss thru a hydrant being frozen up, reported against the claims. Mayor Hendrie recommended that at least 800 tons of coal be kept in reserve at the beach pumping house, and it will be acted on.

The continuance of Sunday watering of streets next summer was discussed, but no definite decision was arrived at. The clerk was instructed to prepare a street-watering bylaw.

The Street Watering Company was awarded the contract for the oil supply.

The Engineer sent in a list of repairs and alterations to be cost about \$1000. The committee decided to discuss them in detail later.

F. A. Austin Arrested. F. A. Austin, who gave his address as the Dominion Hotel, was arrested this evening by P. C. Campaign on a charge of disorderly conduct.

Street Railway Trouble. Manager W. C. Hawkins of the Cataract Power Company, which operates the street railway, says that the company has no intention of bringing "strike-breakers" to the city to break up the Street Railwaymen's Union. He claims he is not opposed to unions, but to unions that act foolishly. He says, also, that when the men asked him the agreements they had signed returned, the company called the whole proposition off. Mr. Hawkins claims no serious trouble between them and the company.

No Prosecution. There will be no prosecution in the case of J. B. O'Neill, in whose store tobacco was found that had been taken from two wholesale dealers, the authorities being satisfied that Mr. O'Neill's wife, who purchased it, had no knowledge that it was stolen.

Blue Label League. As a result of the meeting here of representatives of Canadian local cigar-makers' unions, the organization of a Blue Label League has been formed, which will provide for advertising the blue label through Canada. WHO SPIED CROCKET? Eye of a Cape Boy Responsible for His Capture. London, March 5.—Mr. E. H. Stuart Bruce, in an instructive paper on "Balloons in War," read before the Society of Arts last night, stated that the Boers had refused balloons offered them by a foreign power, saying they did not know how to manage them if they had them.

Several British balloons were destroyed by shell-fire during the war. The Boers found it extremely hard to hit a balloon high in the air, and never attempted it unless the balloon was less than 60 yards from the ground. Major Trollope of the Aldershot Ballooning Department, adding to the war experiences, said that the conquest of Cape Boy was really due to the eye of a Cape boy, who had been taken up in the balloon, and who, beyond the range of English eyes, was able to tell them the artillery was firing at a dummy laager, and that the Boers were hiding in the bed of the river.

BRAVE NEW ZEALANDERS. Praised for Conduct in Operations Against Devet. London, March 5.—A despatch to The Times from Wellington says the Earl of Hopetoun and Federal and State Premiers have telegraphed warm messages in regard to the bravery of New Zealanders in the recent operations against Devet. Hopetoun's message congratulates New Zealand on the magnificent bravery of her sons, and predicts their heroic work must end the war.

BOERS FOR SEVYHELLES. A New Convict Prison to Be Constructed There. London, March 5.—It has been decided to send all Boer prisoners who are sentenced to terms of penal servitude out of South Africa to the Seyvhelles Islands. A new convict prison is to be constructed there for the purpose. Accommodation for 1200 prisoners of war will be ready in Antigua by the middle of April.
