Mr. Boyle remarks that in 1875 the capital invested in municipal undertakings in Great Britain was \$465,000,000,000.

There are now in Great Britain 931 municipalities owning waterworks, 90 owning the street railroads, 249 owning the gas works and 181 supplying electricity. Most of these are in England. Municipalities were not allowed to work the tramways until 1896. It is estimated that half of the gas-users in England use municipal gas.

Glasgow has one-cent and two-cent fares on its city tram cars. On Liver-

fares on its city tram cars. On Liverpool's fine system of double-deck electric cars the fares range from two cents for three miles or less up to eight cents for something over eight miles. Sheffield has appropriated out of its tramway receipts \$75,000 for the erection of shops and business premises which are for reut.


