British Navy Has Nearly Trebled In Size and In Personnel During War

LONDON, Oct. 25 .- Figures made public tonight on the growth of the British navy during the war show that the fleet, including auxiliaries, increased from 2,500,000 tons displacement to 6,500,000 tons, and the personnel from 146,000 to 406,000.

Since the outbreak of the war 21,500,000 soldiers have been transported by sea, of which 4,391 were lost. For the requirements of the British naval and military forces more than 86,000,000 tons of stores were transshipped, while more than 24,000,000 tons were taken overseas for Great Britain's allies. Transportation also was provided for 2,000,000 animals.

The organization of convoys, due to German submarine warfare, has been an important part of the work of the British navy since March, 1917, from which time there have been 75,929 sailings, with the losses numbering only a few hundred vessels.
