British Navy Has Nearly Trebled In Size and In Personnel During War

LONDON, Oct. 25.—Figures made public tonight on the growth of the British navy during the war show that the fleet, including auxiliaries, increased from 2,600,000 tons displacement to 8,500,000 tons, and the personnel from 145,000 to 406,000.

Since the outbreak of the war 51,500,000 soldiers have been transported by sea, of which 4,391 were lost. For the requirements of the British naval and military forces more than 56,000,000 tons of stores were transported, while more than 24,000,000 tons were taken overseas for Great Britain's allies. Transportation also was provided for 2,000,000 animals.

The organization of convoys, due to German submarine warfare, has been an important part of the work of the British navy since March, 1917, from which time there have been 13,929 sailings, with the losses numbering only a few hundred vessels.

The Reichstag Adjourns Until 'Note Digests'

ITALIAN ZONE BLAZES UP TO BATTLE FURY

British, French and Italians Advance.

3,000 PRISONERS TAKEN

Progress on Mountain and Piave River Fronts Despite Bad Weather.

LONDON, Oct. 25.—Italian troops have begun an offensive between the Piave and the Brenta. In the Monte Grappa sector they advanced across the Orsio River and captured Monte Solero, part of Monte Prassolan and Monte Perica.

In the Piave River the Italians have captured the islands of Grave Pata-dapoli and Magliore.

British and French troops are aiding the Italians in their new offensive. According to reports reaching London today, the attacks of the Allies are meeting with considerable success despite the adverse weather conditions.

On the Piave front the British have gained footing on some islands in the river, and captured enemy garrisons of 400 men.

The Italians have made progress between the Brenta and the Piave, overcoming determined resistance, re-captured counter-attacks and captured 400 prisoners.

On the Asiago plateau the French have taken Monte Sisonol, increasing their number of prisoners to 800.

ASKS INCORPORATION OF BRITISH WEST INDIES IN CANADIAN DOMINION

LONDON, Oct. 25.—(Canadian Press dispatch from Reuters's agency).—Writing in United Empire, the Journal of the Royal Colonial Institute, H. J. Grove strongly pleads for the incorporation of the British West Indies within the Dominion of Canada. He emphasizes the economic and strategic importance of the West Indies, and points out that if included with the Dominion, the West Indies would have free entry to the Canadian market and would participate upon an equal footing in Canada's advantageous reciprocity treaties, particularly with the United States, while the confederation of Canada and the West Indies would be an additional incentive for Newfoundland to enter the Dominion.

He suggests that a commission consisting of representatives of each British West Indian island should be formed at the earliest convenience to proceed to Ottawa to discuss the matter with the Canadian authorities. Newfoundland should also be represented on the commission.
