Quorums Are Elusive.

Things were moving along at a belsing some headway, when a divergence of opinion arose. Some members of the commission wanted to build a number of houses for sale on completion. Chairman J. G. Richter objected to this policy, claiming that the commission must have an application for each house before building it. He resigned rather than assent to the plan. This was a month ago. No one has been appointed to succeed him. No one will be appointed antil the next city council meeting two weeks hence. In the meantime, the commission does the best it can, lacking an official chairman. E. R. Dennis says the council is responsible for the commission to being able to get a quorum at its meetings. Another attempt will be made Saturday afternoon.

46 Applications Wait.

Just how little progress has been made was indicated by City Clerk S. Baker last night. He said that the commission had received 131 applications. Of these, 28 have been withdrawn. Arrangements have been made for proceeding with ten of them. Fortysix are awaiting investigation.

Thirty-four have been investigated by P. W. Wilson, and recommended for acceptance, and nothing further has been done with them. Thirteen other houses are held up for various reasons. 


