NICKEL BREAD.

The Globe has succeeded in having the McNaught bread bill, repealed. The first result of the new bill, which will be known as the Nickle bill, is to make at a crime to sell a loaf of bread weighing 16 ounces for five cents. Fancy, bread must not weigh more than 12 ounces, and if a baker tries to give you more he is liable to punishment. Perhaps the baker will sell the 12-ounce loaf for four cents, but it takes just as much time and trouble to make a 12 as a 16-ounce loaf, and the public will probably have to pay for the extra percentage of trouble.
