GRETHA GREEN AT 20 TO 1, WINS CARTER HANCOCK P.

Alfred Noble is Second and Far West Third—Jack Atkin, Favorite, Has Bad Start.

NEW YORK, April 15.—John W. Schorr's Gretha Green, carrying the hoodoo number, 13, in a race of 15 starters, romped home an easy winner to-day in the fifteenth running of the Carter Handicap, beating James E. Gaffney's Alfred Noble to the wire by nearly two lengths. M. L. Schwartz's Far West was third.

The victory came as a big surprise to the experts, most of whom had picked B. Schreiber's Jack Atkin as a sure winner, but the Schreiber entry had the double handicap of a bad start and top weight.

The race marked the opening of the racing season in the east, but, contrary to expectations, it was attended by a much smaller crowd than had been expected.

Similar occasions in the past. The blight which has fallen on racing since the enactment of the betting laws has kept bettors and non-bettors alike away from the tracks. Nevertheless, there was a sprinkling of bookmakers in evidence to-day, who again took their place in the subterfuge hit upon last year of making and recording wagers by nod.

The race was a close one, with Gretha Green, admirably ridden by Burns, jumping into the lead and kept it to the end.

All three horses to finish were practically outsiders, the odds on Alfred Noble being 7 to 1, and on Far West 5 to 1.

The weather was ideal and helped bring out a large feminine contingent, a great number of whom motored to the track.
