C. J. Doherty—Make Penalties More Severe.

Ottawa, May 28.—(Canadian Press)
—A number of important amendments to the criminal code were introduced in the commons this afternoon by Hon.
C. J. Doherty, minister of justice.
One provision defines the court which is to be designated as a criminal court, to meet changes in designation of courts under different provincial laws.

It is proposed to amend section 300 for the purpose of making a person convicted of attempted rape liable to whipping. Such punishment may now be administered in conviction for indecent assaukt, and several judges have assaukt a

whipping. Such punishment hay how be administered in conviction for indecent assault, and several judges have called attention to the anomaly in that similar sentence may not be passed for the graver offence.

Further amendments to the criminal code, submitted by Mr. Doherty, extend the number of kinds of firearms the carrying of which is forbidden. They provide for increasing the age of consent; they provide that a summon issued in one province for the appearance of a person in another shall be issued only under the authorization of the attorney-general of the province in which the summons is issued, and they provide for more severe penalties for keeping disorderly houses. In regard to the last named, a third offence must be punishable by imprisonment.
