The lay representatives shall be elected every year at a meeting to be summoned by the Incumbent, or in case the Parish is vacant, or the Incumbent is absent, or unable to summon suc' meeting, then by the Church Wardens, or either of them; ar shall be held in each Parish, civil or ecclesiastical, upon Easte Monday, or within thirty days thereafter; and they shall con tinue in office until other representatives are appointed.

4. In the case of a vacancy occurring in the representation of he Synod, the vo any Parish, by death, resignation, refusal to act, or otherwise and in this case a r such vacancy may be filled at a special meeting called for that purpose by the Incumbent, or Church Wardens, as provided in the next preceding article.

5. The Rector or Incumbent shall preside at every such meet ing; but if he shall be unable to attend, or if there be no Rector or Incumbent, the persons qualified to vote may appoint a Chair man and proceed to the election.
