PLANS TO BEAT ST. LAWRENCE ICE JAMS BY HEATING WATER

Ottawa, Ont., Nov. 18.—Experiments in heating the waters of the St. Lawrence River adjacent to power generating plants, for the purpose of eliminating interference by ice jams, are to be carried out by the Ontario Hydro-electric Commission. H. G. Acres, its engineer, made a statement to the International Joint Waterways Commission to that effect.

This statement was in answer to a prediction made yesterday by Hugh I. Cooper of New York that ice jams would prove a serious problem in the working out of proposed power development schemes. Mr. Acres was of the opinion that heating plant would obviate wholly the difficulty, which he pointed out, would have to be dealt with merely during the spring break-up of ice.

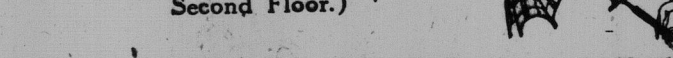

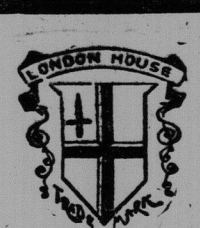
