Imports and Exports in June, as Compared With Other Years.

Ottawa, July 28—(Canadian Press)—The summary of Canada's trade for June shows that imports for consumption were valued at \$61,668,729 as against \$57,943,098 in June 1921, and \$134,092,344 in June 1920, according to the latest available figures.

Imports from the United Kingdom in June 1922 were valued at \$10,728,671 as against \$8,261,848 in June 1921, and \$24,119,019 in June 1920. Imports from U. S. for June 1922 were valued at \$39,001,675 against \$42,197,69 in June 1921, and \$68,074,554 in June 1920.

The total imports for the twelve months ended June 1922, were valued at \$731,893,917 as against \$1,086,311,076 for the corresponding period of 1921-1922, and \$1,210,216,977 for 1920.

The value of the exports of Canadian produce for June 1922 was \$71,760,968 against \$58,576,299 for June 1921, and \$106,837,838 for June 1920. The exports to the United Kingdom were valued at \$29,890,788 during June 1922 as compared with \$22,646,921 in June 1921, and \$54,908,076 in 1920. The value of the total exports of Canadian produce during the twelve months ended June 1922 was \$715,854,904, as against \$1,113,636,823 for the corresponding period of 1921-1922 and \$1,232,832,099 for 1920. June returns show a very favorable balance of trade of \$10,081,884, while the returns for the twelve months period show a favorable balance of \$19,621,677.

MAINE AUTO FATALITY.

North Anson, July 27.—Mrs. Sherman Collins, of Augusta, was drowned and Almon Collins of this town, and his wife and three young children narrowly escaped a similar fate yesterday when a small automobile left the new state highway, three miles below here and plunged into the Kennebec river.

Mr. Collins went to Augusta with his family Tuesday to bring back his sister-in-law. He had been driving practically all night and his view was obstructed by a heavy land fog when he reached a bridge over a culvert about 4 o'clock. In turning to the right one of the wheels struck a fence post.

All six fell into the river with the car on top of them in from four to eight feet of water. Mrs. Almon Collins extricated herself first with the youngest child in her arms whom she carried ashore.

Then the second child came up and she floated it into the top of the car. The third child got beyond her reach,
