### LIVERPOOL HEARS OF FIRES IN CORK

(C. P. R. Despatch.)

Liverpool, Aug. 14.—Persons arriving here from Cork on Saturday said that the government house and other buildings in the city were burning.

Others reaching here from Queenstown reported that some of the buildings in that port were on fire. The latest advices received from Cork are to the effect that, with the exception of the postal service, conditions are normal.

During the burning of the barracks and other buildings several of the irregular troops were entrapped and had to be rescued by means of ladders. The constant explosion of bombs and the rifle fighting created terror among the residents.

### MONCTON AND OTHER TOWNS

(Moncton Transcript.)

One of the features of the last available industrial census of the maritime provinces was the rapid growth of manufacturing in Moncton, while many other manufacturing centres were marking time or going backward. Here are some comparative figures of special interest, showing capital invested in manufacturing and the value of the product:

The jump of five million in the value of the manufacturing of Moncton from 1917 to 1918 is rather remarkable, when it is observed that towns like Fredericton and New Glasgow showed a diminution of manufacturing activity, while Amherst only made a slight gain.
