

On September 7 last, Peter Drinkilis, who owns a fruit store at 1387 St. Catherine owns a fruit store at 1387 St, Catherine surce east, was asked by Feters, a countryman, whom he knew slightly, if he would let him spend the night at his place. Drinkilis consented and they had gone to bed. About 5.80 o'clock the next morning Drinkilis was abruptly awakened by a sharp pain, and saw Peters brandishing a razor in one hand and a revolver in the other.

Drinkilis, half blinded by the rush of blood from his wound, succeeded in blood from his wound, succeeded in grappling with his assailant, but he was slashed three times more and his left eye was gouged out. When he stumbled Peters fired three shots at him, each bul-

BURIAL PERMITS

IT IS HEREBY ANNOUNCED that on and after January first, 1920, accordance with Sec. 35 of the Public Health Act of 1918, and its amendments the body of any deceased person shall not be buried without a permit so to do from the Sub-District Board of Health for the Sub-District in

It is arranged by Regulation of the Minister of Health that such burialpermits shall be granted by the sub-deputy registrars of Vital Statistics, or by one of their assistants, duly appointed for that purpose by the Sub-District Board of Health concerned, for the sub-deputy registrar area in which the death of such person, took place, or in which the burial is to be

Such burial-permits will be made upon the production of a certificate of cause of death, and such permits shall serve as permits for the transportation of the body where such transportation is to be made by a common carrier, and when burial is to be made otherwhere than in the sub-deputy

registrar area where the permit was issued. Posters, in prominent type, will be put up throughout the province, notifying the date of the inception of this service together with the post office address of the sub-deputy registrar of the parish, town or city in
