EDMONTON'S PLANS FOR ROYAL VISIT

Opening of New Parliament Building By the Duke One Feature

Edmonton, Alta., Aug. 29.—Several surprises are in store for the Duke and Duchess de Connaught, who will visit Edmonton on September 3 and 4. The provincial government, the municipality and the people generally have prepared to eclipse all former efforts in entertaining the governor-general and his party during their stay in the capital, the streets of the province and city by Lieutenant Governor Bulyea, Premier Sifton and Mayor Armstrong at ten o'clock on the morning of September 3, after which the king's representative will formally open the parliament building, costing \$1,500,000, in the afternoon.

GRAVE CHARGE MADE AGAINST BANK MAN

Prominent Society Man and Musician is Arraigned to Answer to Defalcation. New Bedford, Aug. 29.—This old New England whaling city, jealous of its virtues, stood aghast when Edgar Lord, regarded as a pillar of the best society, was arraigned in the police court and charged with looting the New Bedford and Acushnet cooperative banks of which he was treasurer.

It is estimated the defalcations will total \$20,000. Lord was held in \$25,000 bail for a hearing on September 10. He made no statement in court, but denies the charges.

Big and distinguished looking with long hair and eyeglasses, the accused man appeared crushed by the blow.

Lord is one of the most accomplished musicians of the state. He is the organist and choir master of the Calvary Baptist church of Providence, R. I. Before taking this position, two years ago, he was the organist of the Trinitarian church of this city.

He has a wife and four children. They are at his summer home at Mattapoisett. The alleged stealings cover ten years. It is believed the method was by means of fake loans.

A DOUBLE ACCIDENT

London, Aug. 29.—As Claude Graham White, British aviator, and his wife, while flying from South End on Sea to Claxton, a defect in the motor compelled them to descend to the surface of the water. The machine was taken in to join by yacht, and Mr. and Mrs. Graham White were brought on board. Soon afterwards the yacht went ashore and could not be got off until this morning.

WIDOW SHOWS RESENTMENT

Result of Probate Court Proceedings in Charlotte County. St. Andrew's Beacon.—When Frank McLaughlin, of Honeysdale, died, leaving his property badly encumbered with debts, administration was taken out by George F. Beach, one of the heaviest creditors. Mr. Beach was proceeding under the authority of the probate court to dispose of the property for the benefit of the creditors, when the widow, Anna McLaughlin, took a hand in the game. Adopting raffish methods, she seized her hatchet and proceeded to destroy everything in sight on the farm. The windows of the house were broken, the trees in the orchard girdled and destroyed, the well filled up and polluted and a great deal of other mischief done.

She was arrested and is now in jail awaiting trial under the Speedy Trial Act. When she was visited in jail last Thursday by Clerk of the Court Stevens she was in very repentant mood and expressed regret at the action she had taken in her anger.
