Jail Physician and Turnkey Examined By Coroner Berryman and Adjournment Until Monday Evening is Made

That four months of the diet provided in the county jail for hard labor prisoners is enough to make any man anaemic was the startling statement made last was the starting statement made last night by Dr. James Christie at the inquiry before Coroner Berryman into the death of William McArthur, who died in the General Public Hospital a few hours after having been taken there from the jail. "It has been happening for years to long term prisoners in the jail to get anameic. Let any man be on a stereotyped diet for four months as this man was, and he would lose his appetite. Why, they have got nothing so appetizing even as a potato and salt.
