Fredericton, Oct. 28.—Ichabod Gallagher, aged eighty-two years, died suddenly at his home at Kingsclear yesterday afternoon. He is survived by his wife and five sons, George, Samuel, Walter and Tabor of Kingsclear, and Wardlaw of Fredericton, and one daughter, Miss Ethel, at home.

Lewis Dunsmore.  
Lewis Dunsmore of Princeton, Maine, died there this week. He was a resident of Young's Cove, N. B., until about four years ago when he joined the United States army. Last winter he contracted influenza from the effects of which he never fully recovered, tuberculosis developing. He is survived by his wife and one child, four sisters and two brothers, also his father, Stanley Dunsmore and Ernest A. Roosevelt of Princeton, are brothers, and the sisters are George, a graduate nurse, of Bellevue Hospital, New York; Mrs. David Jeffrey, of Young's Cove Road; Nancy and Olive at home. ## NEW YORK LADY MISSING

New York, Oct. 29.—A confidential police alarm has gone out for Mrs. Elizabeth Thurston, widow of Colonel Nathaniel Blunt Thurston, of the New York National Guard, who left her home at 527 Manhattan avenue, Saturday afternoon, saying she would return in half an hour, and who has not been seen since. Mrs. Thurston, not given to trusting banks and safe deposit vaults, wore a number of diamonds and carried with her in a chamois bag other jewelry, valuable papers and Colonel Thurston's medals.

According to Mrs. Margaret Walsh, who lives with her, Mrs. Thurston left home in apparent good spirits, although she previously had not been well. She had been so regular in her habits and so little inclined to remain away that Mrs. Walsh became frightened when she did not return promptly. It had been Mrs. Thurston's custom to visit her husband's grave each Sunday, but when she did not do this today, and inquiry among her relatives failed to elicit information, Mrs. Walsh decided to notify the police.

Mrs. Thurston is a woman of sixty years, about five feet three inches tall, and has grey eyes and grey hair. She was dressed entirely in black. The bureau of missing persons at police headquarters has no record of an unidentified person corresponding to her description, being in any hospital.

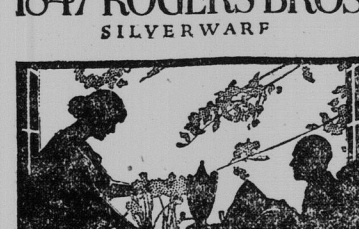
