## CORRESPONDENTS FROM THE MARITIME PROVINCES.

Mr. D. M. Gordon introduced to the House the Rev. William McMillan, Minister of Saltsprings in the Presbytery of Pictou, and the Rev. Robert McCunn, Minister of River John in the same Presbytery, who had been appointed by the Synod of the Maritime Provinces Corresponding Members to attend this meeting and take part in their deliberations. These Correspondents presented their Commissions and were welcomed by the Moderator. Their names were ordered to be added to the Synod Roll.

The Clerk was instructed to add the name of the Rev. William Mc-Millan to the Committee on References, Complaints and Appeals, and that of the Rev. Robert McCunn to the Committee on Bills and Overtures.

The Rev. George Wells, Minister of the American Presbyterian Church in this City, being present, was invited to sit and deliberate with the House.

## SUSTENTATION FUND.\*

Dr. Jenkins, Chairman of the Board, presented and read the annual Report and appended financial statements of the Managers of the Sustentation Fund. These documents were referred to a Committee, consisting of Mr. John S. Burnet, Convener; Messrs. James B. Mullan, Alexander Macdonald, Macmorine; Ault and Rutherford, with instructions to consider the same and report thereon to the Synod at a future Diet.

## APPLICATIONS FOR LICENSE.

Application was made by the Presbytery of Quebec for leave to take Mr. David W. Morrison, B.A., Student of Divinity, on public Probationary trials for License. A similar application was made by the Presbytery of London in behalf of Mr. Alexander Campbell, B.A. The Synod, having ascertained that Circular Letters, intimating the intention of these Presbyteries to make said application, had been duly issued, instructed Messrs. Morrison and Campbell to appear before the Examining Committee.

## RECEPTION OF DELEGATE FROM THE UNITED STATES.
