- Q.159. From there you did what?
- A.159. Got my hat, cost and web belt and proceeded down to the company.
- Q.160. Did you see the accused, Pte. Lilley, in your room when you came back from breakfast?
- A.160. No sir, I didn't.
- Q.161. Did Mr. Wood meet you that morning and ask you if you had his wellet?
- A.161. He did sir on the way down to the company, when we were on the road.
- Q.162. Had you seen it?
- A.162. No sir, I hedn't.

CROSS-EXAMINED BY THE PROSECUTOR

- Q.163. When you saw Pte. Lilley in your room at 0730 what was he doing?
- A.163. He was 'ust performing his regular duties, if I remember correctly.
- Q.164. Was Mr. Wood in the room at that moment?
- A.164. He was, yes.
- Q.165. And then Mr. Wood went to the washroom?
- A. 165. Yes. I preceded Mr. Wood to the washroom.
- Q.166. Yes, and after you had been there a short time he arrived?
- A.166. Yes sir.
- Q.167. Did you see this wallet of Mr. Wood's that morning at all?
- A. 167. No I dien't sp.
- Q.168. Was there snybody else besides yourself, Mr. Wood and the accused in your room that morning when you were there?
- A.168. Yes, when I was there Capt. Roy came in, I remember that. He was in there first. He woke us up.
- Q.169. And was anytody else in?
- A.169. Not that I know of.
- Q.170. Just you and Mr. Wood occupied that room?
- A.170. Yes.
- Q.171. And the accused was betman for both of you?
- A.171. Yes.
- Q.172. Did you have any other tatman at that time?
- A.172. No we didn't sir.
- Q.173. What was the condition of Mr. Wood's bed when you departed for the washroom?
