M.S.A. DEFAULTERS ARE NOT FREE YET

Government Will Consider Cases and Probably Punish in Some Way Those Men Who Have Dodged Service.

Ottawa, Nov. 13.—Men who defaulted under the Military Service Act are to have their position considered by the government. While no further calls are being made for draftees, representations have been made, it is understood, that men who failed to respond should be punished by being disfranchised for a period of years after the conclusion of peace. Under the Military Service Act a man who without reasonable excuse fails to report, is liable to five years' imprisonment. In addition, a man convicted of an offense under the M.S.A. is disfranchised by the War Times Election Act. But the latter provision applies to the case of conviction. A large number of prosecutions have been taken against defaulters but there are still, it is stated, some thousands who have not yet been prosecuted. It is the position of these which is to be taken up.
