Female Munition Workers Be lieve They Are Entitled to a Fifteen Cents Per Hour Bonus - Reported They Will Hold Meeting.

Will Floid Meeting. It is stated that the female muni-tion workers, engaged in the manufac-ture of munitions during the past Autumn, believe they are entitled to a fifteen cent per hour bonns. While cuployed they received twenty-five cents per hour, and finding that the male munition workers are endeavor-ing to procure a twenty cent bonus, the women workers believe they are entitled to a rate of forty cents hourly, and not receiving that amount will investigate at once so as to learn if their contentions are legal.
