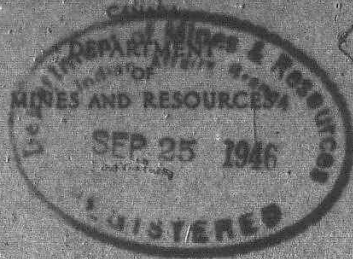

Dear Mr. Hoey:

I appreciate your letter of the 16th with regard to attending the Six Nations Fair, and though sorry to hear you find it impossible to come personally, it will be a pleasure to have Colonel Neary here.

Perhaps you might suggest to Colonel Neary that he arrive here on Wednesday morning the 25th. While the first day of the Fair is not important, if he comes then we can spend the time visiting around the schools etc. and on the Reserve seeing conditions, and as the schools are closed on both Thursday and Friday so that the children and parents can attend the Fair.

Also, if he only arrives Friday, the important Fair day, - it is always crowded and busy and there would be little opportunity to see the schools or the Mohawk Institute, or to discuss matters in general.

Please inform Colonel Neary that reservations are made for him at the Kerby House as from Wednesday morning, and unless I hear further those arrangements will be considered convenient.
