The night school for the working boys in St. Nicholas', which was unavoidably delayed until January, was attended by thirty-two boys, and according to the report of the teacher, during the period it was open—three months—they were punctual and attentive to the work assigned to them and gave every evidence of appreciation of the advantages offered. With the approval of His Grace the Archbishop, the Reverend Mother Superior of St. Joseph's Convent placed one of the sisters, an experienced teacher, in charge of the night school.
