SUBMISSIONS BY CAUGHNAWAGA IROQUOIS-REPRESENTATION ON COMMISSION

Mr. Caouette: Mr. Speaker, I have a supplementary question for the minister.

Could he tell us first of all-my question is twofold-whether the Caughnawaga Iroquois have made representations asking to come under either the federal government or the provincial government?

Secondly, have the Caughnawaga Indians asked to be represented on the commission with a view to submitting claims to or dealing with the federal government? Finally, and this is vital, do they wish to come under provincial rather than federal jurisdiction?

Mr. Chrétien: Mr. Speaker, we intend to have discussions with all Indians in every province, including the province of Quebec. When we go to the province of Quebec to negotiate, we will meet with the leaders of the Quebec Brotherhood of Indians and those of the provincial government.
