#### The New Terror

WHILE the naval question in Canada is being definitely thrashed out in all its pros and cons, a description of Britain's latest warship may be somewhat of general interest.

The Colossus has a displacement of between 22,000 and 23,000 tons, while her length from stern to bow meas-

ures 546 feet.

Her heavy guns will be 12 inch, of 50 calibres in length, and capable of developing a muzzle energy of 53,000 foot-tons, whereas the make of 12-inch guns mounted in the Dreadnought only develop a muzzle energy of 47,000 foot-tons.

The anti-torpedo defence armament is also increased in power by the substitution of 4-inch breachloaders, fring a 31-lb. shot, instead of a 3-inch gun firing a 1½-lb. shot.

The contract speed remains the

same, 21 knots, but as all the earlier type of Dreadnoughts worked upon trial to about 22 knots, the Colossus may expect to do likewise.

She represents an improvement upon the older designs and is longer and heavier and her engines are more powerful.

By her great length she can bear her ten heavy guns on either broad-side, which is a feat hitherto considered almost impracticable.

The improvement in the Colossus is due to the adoption of the enechelon system of two amidship tur-rets, each of which can thereby be trained to fire across the deck on the opposite beam to that on which it is mounted.

The Colossus, which was laid down at the establishment of Messrs.
