In Re Squire the validity of a commission of inquiry issued by
the Govt Genl purporting to be under the Imp Act re
removal of colonial officers was in question.
It was held that the Legis assembly of Que. had
no power to abolish the old court of Impeach-
ment established before Confed. by the Parliament
of Canada for trying complaints against C.B. judges.
The decision must be taken to be that legis in
reference to removal of judges in Sec 96 must come
from Dominion Parliament.

Sec 101.

Bill of Can. may provide for Crt. of Appeal for Can. & establish
any additional courts.

The law in no case could apply to Quebec
her judicial system is the Customs
of Paris. This clause section has been
construed to apply to three provinces only
Grey of B.C. Columbia taken from Quebec
with Taylor, Wood & Smith of Manitoba
