I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the S4th instant with which you forwarded Dr. P. A. McDonald's accounts for profedsional services rendered to Indians of your Agency, and in reply I beg to say that these accounts are considered very large. It would appear that more frequent attendance was given by the Doctor than was necessary. Dr. McDonald's accounts for the year 1907, amounting to \$312.75, and those rendered by Dr. Bowman amounting to \$300.25 make a total outlay of \$613.00 for medical attendance for the year. This amount exceeds by \$413.00 the amount formerly paid Dr. Bowman for

You should bring this matter before the Indians and have them understand clearly what a large expenditure has been incurred for medical attendance, etc. It is thought it might be well to have one or both physicians paid by salary.
