Ottawa June 20, 1908.

Sir,-

Referring to your recent survey of Burnt Island and the shore line adjacent to the Island in the Township of Robinson, I have to say that in view of the extra ordinary discrepancy between your survey and the original survey made by J.W.Fitzgerald P.L.S., in 1879 it has been decided to have the whole southerly shore line of the Township of Robinson surveyed, and I have to request you to perform this service at as early a date as you can make it convenient.

Before, however, commencing the work we require to have your account for the survey of Burnt Island, which you have already made, and an approximate estimate of the cost of the survey now proposed.

In the said survey you will please be guided by the following instructions.- The shore line is to be traversed in the usual manner. The distances may be measured by stadia, or micrometer, and the bearings should refer to the astronomic meridian.

At the intersections of the East and West town line and of the several side lines and Concession lines you will please plant two posts, one on each side of the road allowance, and the both of them at a
