Sir,-

I have to request you to be good enough to re-establish by survey the line between the land occupied by an Indian, Simon Francis and John McCarthy in the Morell Indian Reserve Kings County, P. E. I. If the line is a straight one, plant an iron post at each end and one or more wooden posts along the line as may be necessary. A blue print plan is enclosed herewith showing the class of iron post to be used; you may order these to be made in your own locality and charge the cost in your account. The price usually paid is from 75 to 90 cents each post.

Also enclosed is a blue print plan of the reserve; indicate thereon the line you will have re-established and the posts you will have planted.

Before making the survey please communicate with Mr. O. Arsenault, Asst. Indian Superintendent, St. Chrysostome Box 25, who will give you all the assistance in his power.
