

JOHN WATT, born August 1790; died November or December, 1881.

of Claymires, Rothiemay, Banffshire, Scotland. Lived all of his long life in his native parish, on his farm of Claymires. He was married twice, his second wife being Eliza MacIntosh, grandmother to the children of Alexander King. She was 18 years younger than her husband John Watt. He was a man of intelligence, could read newspapers and all books, and the Bible. He also was a good writer. His father, named Alexander Watt was aged 99 when he died, and his father, John Watt lived to 100 years. Six generations in all of father and son lived on the same farm of Claymires. John Watt, our grandfather, being the last one of his name to live there. He remembered about Napoleon and the battle of Waterloo, and many other events of those days. He was highly respected by all who knew him, known for his honesty and uprightness. He was the oldest man in the parish at the time of his death. His family consisted of four children of first wife; two sons and two daughters, and three children of second wife, one son and two daughters. By Eliza Wissing.

Eliza MacIntosh, second wife of John Watt, born in Grantown on Spey, Inverness-shire, Scotland, in 1808, third child and second daughter of Peter MacIntosh and his wife, Margaret Innes. She had two brothers, Robert, who was drowned in River Spey at age of 22, and Peter, who became a sheep farmer in Wales. Had also seven sisters, all married, as follows:

- Marion, the eldest went to Carlisle, Eng.
- Margaret—Mrs. Riach, lived in Aberdeen. *Riach*
She had sons who went to sea.
- Jean—Mrs. Cruickshank, had sons who went south to London, Boston, England.
- Jemima—Mrs. Brown, childless.
- Annie—Mrs. Annard, one son. *Annard*
- Jessie—Mrs. Garden, had a large family of sons and daughters in Aberdeen and some in U. S. A.
- Helen—Mrs. Grant, stayed in Grantown. Their father, Peter MacIntosh came from Badenoch in Highlands of Scotland. He was a Free Mason, a piper and dancer; kept a bake shop in Grantown; spoke only Gaelic until taught English by his wife.
