Fourth witness W.R. Constable Ernest P. Turner, Reading Borough Police  
States:-

At 11.15 P.M. on Saturday the 18th January 1941, I was called to the  
yard of the "Plough Inn" P.H., School Road, Tilehurst, Reading, where  
I saw the prisoner. He was drunk, and from what I was told by the Lie-  
utenant, I made an examination of the rear door of the public house,  
which leads to the living room and found that the staple of the lock  
had been forced off. I said to the prisoner, "I am going to arrest you  
and charge you with being drunk and also with doing wilful damage to  
this door." He made no reply. I arrested him and brought him to the  
Reading Police Station (Borough) and when formally charged and cau-  
tioned he made no reply to either charge. He was then detained in the  
Police Cells.
