Fourth witness W.R. Constable Ernest P. Turner, Reading Borough Police
States:-

At 11.15 P.M. on Saturday the 18th January 1941, I was called to the yard of the 'Plough Inn' P.H., School Road, Tilehurst, Reading, where I saw the prisoner. He was drunk, and from what I was told by the Licensese, I made an examination of the rear door of the public house which leads to the living room and found that the staple of the lock had been forced off. I said to the prisoner, 'I am going to arrest you and charge you with being drunk and also with doing wilful damage to this door.' He made no reply. I arrested him and brought him to the Reading Police Station (Borough) and when formally charged and cautioned he made no reply to either charge. He was then detained in the Police Cells.
