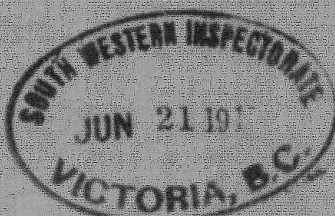

Dear Sir;

I write you concerning Edith Jackson, a pupil of our school, who has \$10500.00 to her credit in the Bank.

She has been in the school ever twelve years, and has had no holidays, with one exception, for many years. I took her to Breckton Point early last spring and paid her board for six weeks, feeling that a change was absolutely necessary. A great many of the older girls receive little money to buy things that the Institute does not provide. Edith has never been remembered by her friends in this way.

She is now 16 years of age, and I think, it would be the right thing to let her have the spending of a small sum of money under the direction of the Matron. She should also have a few weeks holiday this year. The expenses should be paid from her own money.

I may say that she is not a robust girl, and needs the very best of care just at this time.

I think she should have at least \$100.00 per annum for extras while she remains in school.
