We are in receipt of your letter of the 22nd instant herein. We will communicate with you in a few days in regard to this matter.

In the meantime we think it is only fair that, as pointed out to you in our letter of the 19th instant, the onus of establishing the identity of the Lake as Cariboo Bill's Lake should rest on Mr. Henderson who has attacked the present position, and not on us, who have for so long rested on the decision of the Board, which the Board itself should not upset without the strongest reasons being shown it by some interests other than the holder of rights under the Board's own decision.
