BERLIN SAYS GERMANS MAKE GAINS IN THE ARGONNE

Berlin, by wireless, December 31.—The official statement issued by the German War Office says the artillery of the Allies has destroyed part of Western Belgium and that the big guns of the French have "systematically destroyed" Steinbach in Upper Alsace.

GERMAN FINANCIAL RESOURCES SOUNDED

Economic and Financial Exhaustion of That Country will do Much to End Present World Strife

PAPER MONEY INFLATION

The economic and financial exhaustion of Germany will in the end more to end the war than anything else. That being so, it is of the utmost importance to get at the real facts bearing upon the economic situation in that country.

The Berlin correspondent of the New York Analyst reports that at the beginning of December the German labor market is improving in tone. Labor, he says, is finding readier employment, and in some branches of industry, like coal mining and the iron trade, there are complaints of a scarcity of workmen.
