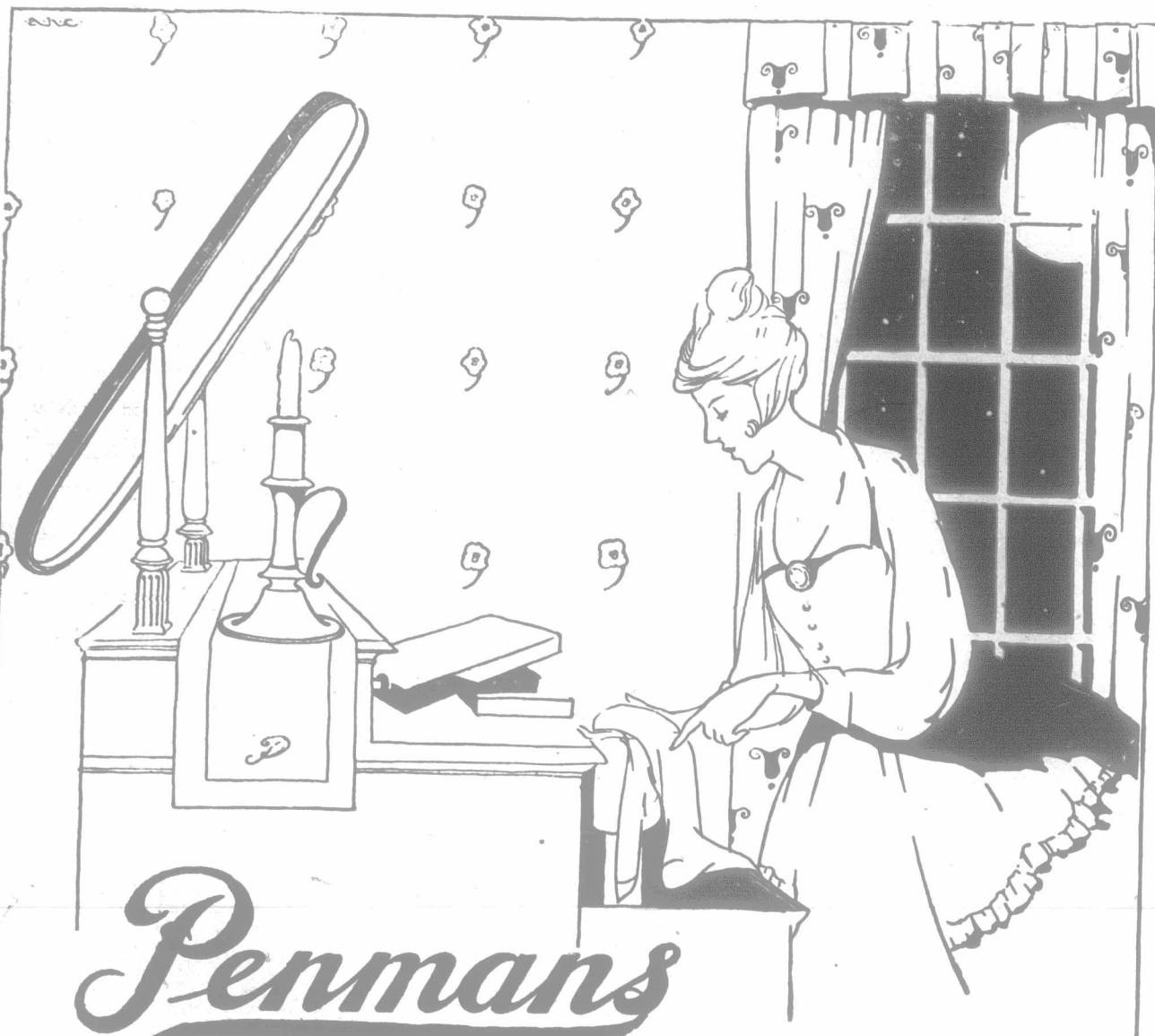


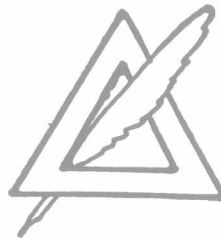

Sienkiewicz, the Polish author, whose most widely known book is "Quo Vadis," died in Switzerland last week.

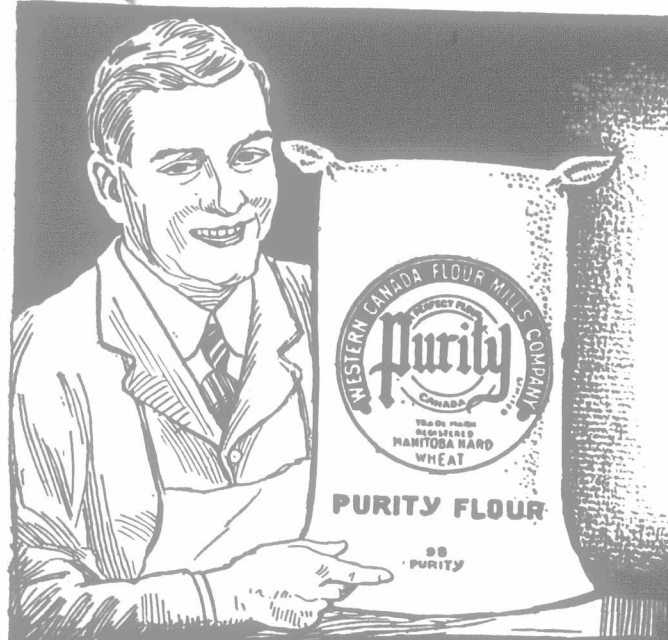
A French aviator, Captain de Beauchamp, on Nov. 17th, dropped bombs on the station at Munich.
