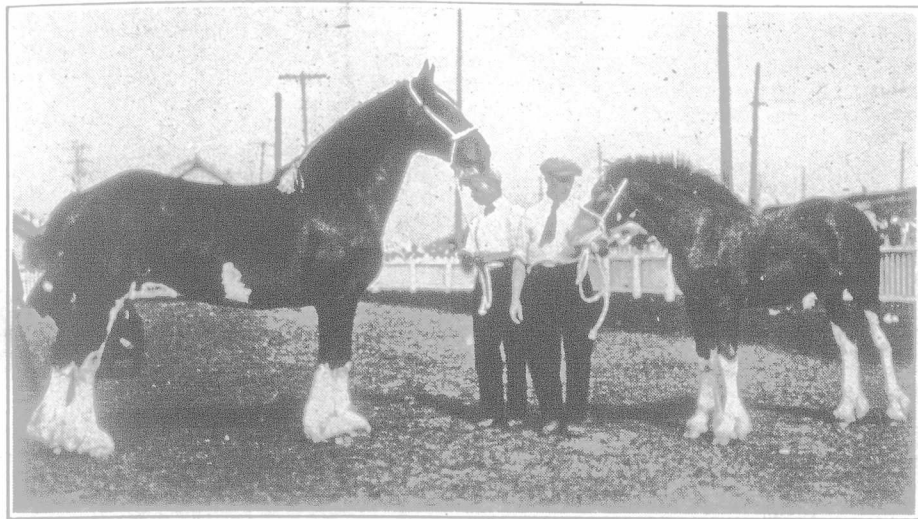
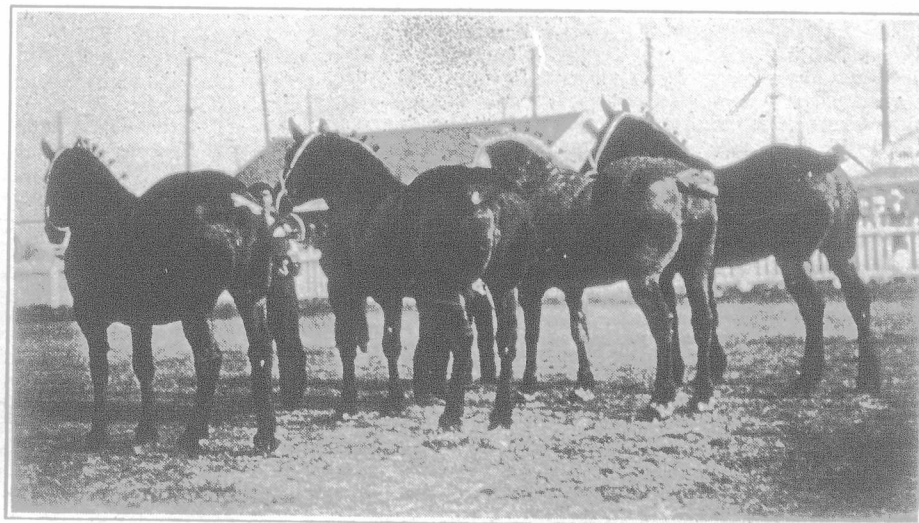

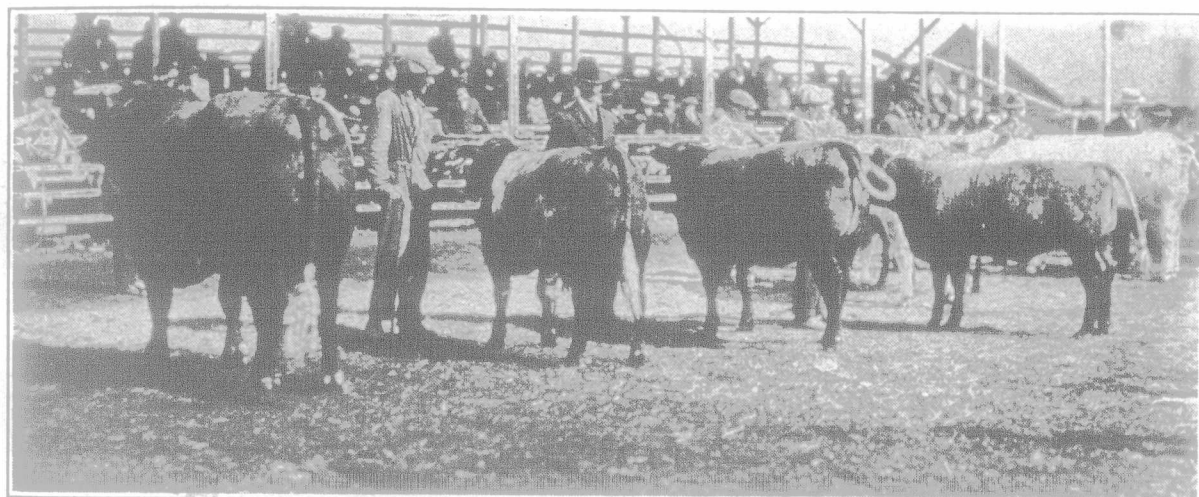
Syringa and Her Foal.

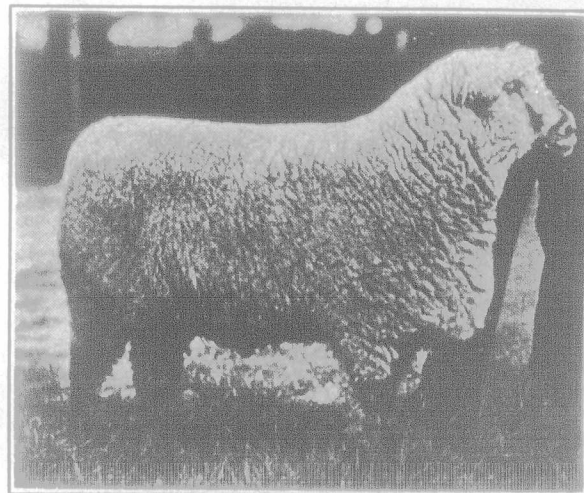

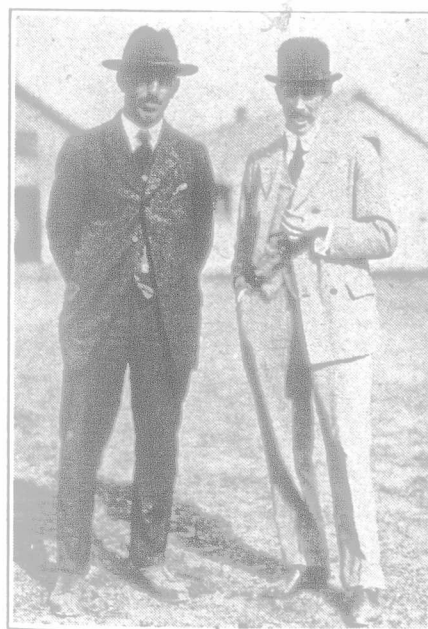

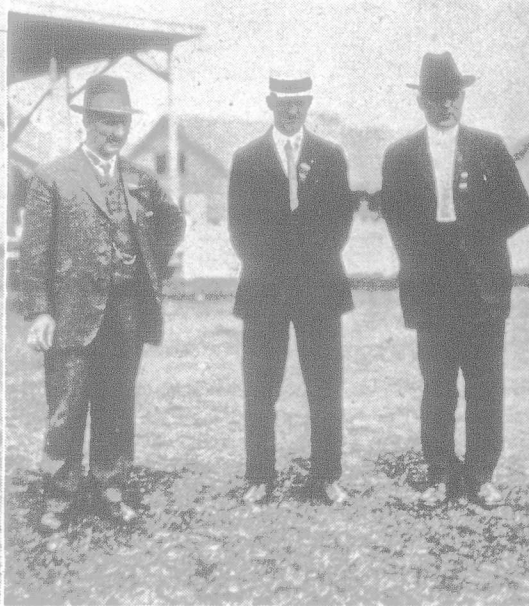

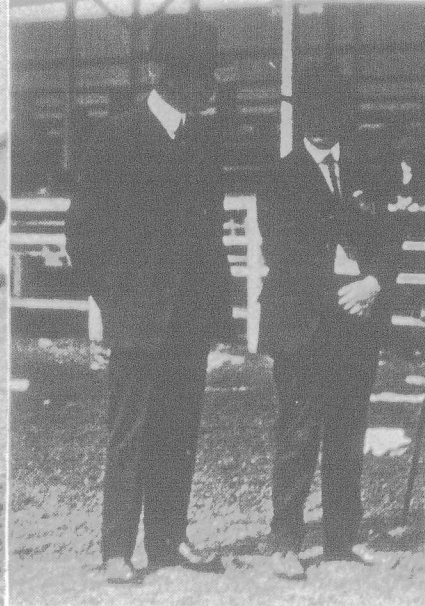

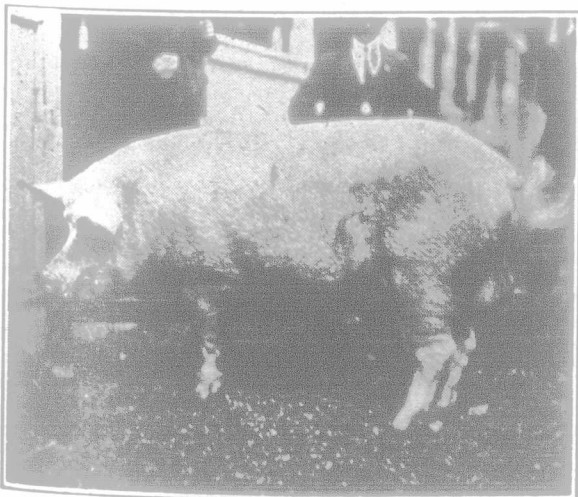

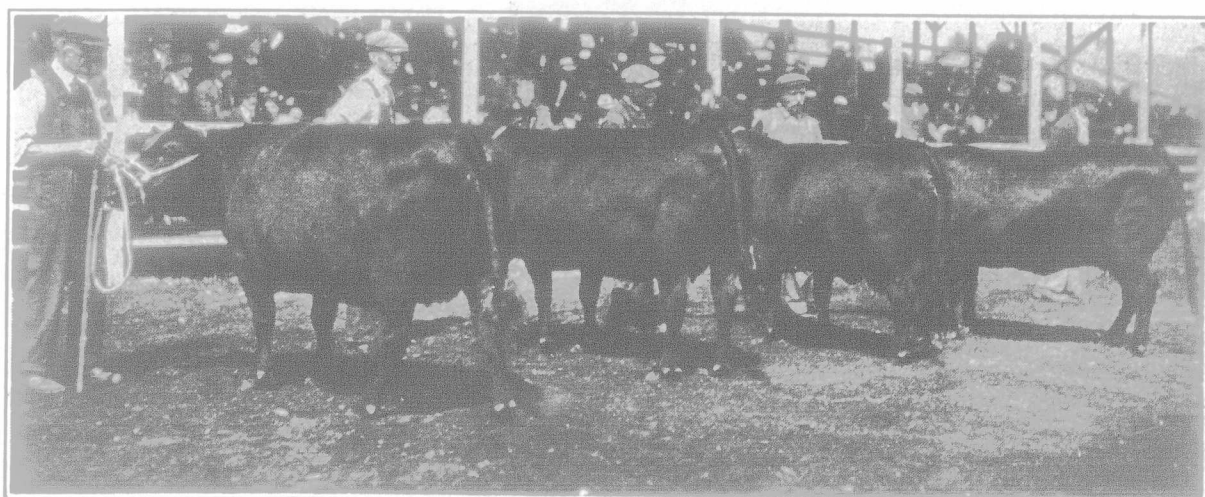
