ture be able to judge of the true and exact State of the Province Accounts; which, from their being blended with each other, and no Period fixed, the House hitherto has never been able to do, and that the Treafurer be required to give Security for the faithful Discharge of his Office.

Ordered, that the faid Message be presented by Mr. Butler and Mr. Procter.

The Council acquainted the House by Message, that they had agreed to the Bill for a Tax on Wheel Carriages.

Refolved, That Mr. Speaker do report to his Excellency the Governor, that the Seat in this House of William Welch, Esq.; Representative for the Town of Horton, is vacant.

A Message came from his Excellency the Governor, requiring the Attendance of the House in the Council-Chamber;
