MESSAGE from His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by Mr. Secretary George :

Mr. Speaker,

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor commands this House to attend His Excellency, immediately, in the Council Chamber.

Accordingly, Mr. Speaker, with the Houfe, went up to attend His Excellency in the Council Chamber ;

And being returned,

Mr. Speaker reported that the House had attended His Excellency in the Council Chamber, where His Excellency had been pleased to make a SPEECH; of which Mr. Speaker said he had, to prevent mistakes, obtained a Copy, which he read to the House, and is as follows:

Mr. President and Gentlemen of His Majesty's Council,

Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the Houfe of Affembly,

T is with fatisfaction, I again meet you in General Affembly ; feeling affured, from your. former conduct, that your deliberations will be directed to promote the honor of His Majefly's Government, and the fafety and profperity. of this Province.

When we last met, the critical situation of affairs, occasioned by the war in which His Majesty is justly engaged for the defence of his **Crown**; the independence of his People, and the commerce of his Subjects; filled our minds with ferious apprehensions; it is, therefore, with great pleasure, I now congratulate you on the favourable alteration in the afpect of public affairs.

The patrictic and determined spirit of the Spaniards, to maintain the independence of their nation, and result the usurpation and despotsion of France, has enabled His Majeffy to discontinue hostilities against Spain.

The friccels which has hitherto attended his Majefty's great exertions in this juft and glorious cause affords the most flattering hopes, that the friendly connexion to long withed for by both nations, and now to happily formed, will be permanent. The
