British News

Metal in any shape or form is not to be allowed to go from Great Britain to Germany. An indication of the extent of Great Britain's efforts to keep metals out of Germany, may be seen in the official request to pack whatever food may be sent to prisoners of war in Germany in cardboard or wooden boxes; or if the provision is such as to be put up in tin boxes or cans, that glass or earthenware be substituted. The export of tin already has been prohibited to the Scandinavian countries and Holland.

The text of the price of coal limitations bill, which was issued recently, specifies that coal may not be sold at the pit mouth at a price exceeding four shillings a ton more than the price at which the same kind of coal was sold during the 12 months ending June 30, 1914. The measure was introduced in the House of Commons by Walter Runciman, the President of the Board of Trade. Violators of the act are liable to a fine not exceeding \$500.

An inquest was held at the powder mills at Hanworth, near Twickenham, on the victim of an explosion. It was stated that the deceased was hurled through the air a distance of 250 yards from the glazing house in which the explosion originated, across a river, and through a tiled roof into a vat containing sulphuric acid. The manager said that only one man was employed at a time in the glazing-house. The witness could offer no explanation of the cause of the accident. All the employees were searched before entering the premises and changed their clothes for overalls in which there were no pockets. They were not allowed to carry any matches or tobacco. There was a ton of powder in two tubs in the glazing house but there was no powder loose anywhere. The premises were protected by the National Guard, and no foul play was suspected. Chief in-

spector of the explosives, stated the history of the firm had been a marvellous one in view of the size of the premises, there having been on one fatal accident since 1878, and that case it was due to the man's carelessness and disobedience of orders.

A motor ambulance service is being established by the London county council. An essential feature of the ambulance scheme for London is the use by the police in uniform for the purpose of summoning ambulances of private telephones, an indication tablet, being placed upon premises where telephones are, by the courtesy of the occupants, available for the purpose.

In all the prisons throughout Great Britain hard labor prisoners are being employed upon war work, said a London newspaper. The character of the work performed cannot be stated according to this report, but a high official at the home office said the prisoners' output was double that on peace tasks. He added: "Some millions of articles already have been made at the mills throughout the land are one vast factory of war stores."

Viscount Haldane, former lord high chancellor, was presented the other day, with an address, signed by 600 members of the House of Commons, expressing appreciation of his public services. The function to place in the House of Commons about 800 signers of the address was presented by Viscount Haldane, in that the members of parliament for the confidence, carefully avoided any reference to the recent incident between himself and David Lloyd George the munitions minister. The speaker was the first to commend the liberality that they work after war for the advancement of the idea of education and national efficiency. He said that the close of the present conflict would offer a fruitful field for efforts of this kind.

Eminent scientists and inventors have been appointed to assist Admiral Lord Fisher, who was recently selected as chairman of the Inventions Board, the duties of which will be to co-ordinate and encourage scientific work in relation to the requirements of the navy. The board will consist of a central committee and a number of consultants, who will advise the main committee on questions of naval science. The central committee will be composed of Admiral Fisher, Sir Joseph John Thomson, Cavendish professor of experimental physics at Cambridge University, Charles A. Parsons, an expert on turbines, and George J. Boileau, chief man of the Royal Technical College at Glasgow.
