


To Open Credit for Entente

Buenos Aires, Jan. 15 .- The Foreign Minister to-day signed an agreement with the British and French ministers to sell 2,500,000 tons of wheat (over 83,000,000 bushels) to the Entente Allies. Argentina is to open a credit at the Bank of the Nation in favor of the allies, which is to be liquidated in two years. This arrangement is virtually a huge loan to the allies and is made in order to stabilize the rate of exchange.


