Hissed Crown Prince.
The defeat inflicted upon his troops by the Franco-American forces on the Marne not only has cost the German Crown Prince his prestige with his men, but is now costing him his popularity with his father's subjects.
Just after the battle of the Marne the Crown Prince passed through Cherbouen, on the Rhine, where he was met by crowds of Germans, mostly women and old men. As the German heir's car passed they jeered and insulted him. Police and troops were called to restore order and several rioters were arrested.
Information which has leaked through to Germany by way of Switzerland or the continual arrival of American forces on the battlefield has greatly helped to demoralize the German middle classes, who now see that German headquarters reports have deceived the people.
Buildings of Salonic.
Brick is the most common kind of building material in Salonic, and in all New Greece. Wooden structures are rare, on account of the shortage of timber. Stone is little used, except for underground walls and foundations. Ordinary walls are built with both plain and hollow bricks. The former, being more solid, are generally used for the building of lower stories, while hollow bricks are commonly employed in the upper stories. The principal kind of roofing used is made of flat tiling.

London, Ont., Oct. 1.—Mr. George M. Reid has been chosen by the Minister of Finance to head the London Victory Loan organization, and his acceptance has been announced. Mr. Reid was one of the chief lieutenants of the late Sir George C. Gibbons in the last campaign, when nearly \$7,000,000 worth of bonds were sold in London.
