PERMANENT SIDEWALKS

After fully considering the matter of submitting to the ratepayers a by-law raising by debentures a large sum of money for local improvements in the form of granolithic walks, the village council has decided to take action only on the initiative of interested property owners on the different streets. Under sections 678 and 680, of the Consolidated Municipal Act, chap 19, the council is empowered (without submitting a by-law) to raise money by debentures, or use the general funds of the corporation, to pay 40 per cent of the cost of permanent sidewalks. Such sidewalks may be constructed when two-thirds of the property owners on a certain street or section of a street, petition in their favor, and when three-fourths of the council are favorable to the expenditure.

Property owners paying 60 per cent of the cost of permanent walks will be exempt from the payment of that portion of the general rate for sidewalks for such period as may be named in the petition, agreed upon by the council, or fixed by arbitration.

This, in brief, is the position in which the council has chosen to leave the permanent sidewalk question, and it now rests with enterprising rate payers to take such action as they think best. Should there becomemant a general desire on the part of property owners to take action under the statute, the council will no doubt bring on an engineer and have a complete survey and plans made for the whole village, so that uniformity of levels may be maintained and the cost of any particular section be accurately determined.

PUBLIC SCHOOL BOARD

The public school board held their regular monthly meeting on Monday evening. All the members were present, the chairman presiding. The business docket was light, only one small account being presented.

Matters of general interest to the school were discussed. The separation of the playgrounds of the girls and boys by the erection of a fence received favorable consideration, and this will probably be done. A half dozen poplars have been purchased for the front of the school property, and for surrounding the rest of the grounds Mr Thomas Howarth has kindly donated sufficient soft maples.

Mr Dickinson of Kemptonville, agent for fire escapes, was present and brought this important matter before the board. It being the opinion that the Education Department had passed some regulation in respect to this matter, the secretary was instructed to write the department for information in order that all requirements might be fully met.

The new heating apparatus was reported to be giving excellent satisfaction.

Principal Burchell attended the meeting and consulted with the board in relation to the subjects discussed.

Moved by A. E. McLean seconded by E. Taylor that by law to appoint an Inspector of buildings be now read a second time short.—Carried.

Moved by E. J. Purcell seconded by E. Taylor that the by law to appoint an Inspector of buildings be now filled in with the name of John McKenny, be read a third time, be numbered 187 and be signed by the Reeve and Clerk and have the Corporate Seal attached.—Carried.

Moved by A. E. McLean seconded by E. Taylor that the auditor's report for 1907 be received and adopted.—Carried.

Moved by E. J. Purcell seconded by A. E. McLean that account of Dr Purvis \$8.00, re smallpox epidemic 1907 be paid.—Carried.

Moved by E. J. Purcell seconded by E. Taylor that account of J. P. Lamb \$1.70 for fixing snow-road on Elgin st. by order of Reeve be paid.—Carried.

Moved by E. J. Purcell seconded by A. E. McLean that account of M. B. Holmes for money paid for charity \$1.59 be paid.—Carried.

There being no further business the Council adjourned until next regular meeting first Monday in May or at call of the Reeve.
