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JAPANESE TURNED BACK

They Had Spent Their Money and Were on the Door. Wednesday's Seattle Post-Intelligencer says that one of the largest arrivals of Japanese in the United States for many months occurred last Monday night when the steamer 'Thiala' arrived in port with 56 men and six women, all of whom, with the exception of two, had been allowed to disembark at Seattle. The Japanese said their destination was Seattle, and that they expected to run their claims for the money payment. The entire party arrived at Vancouver on April 25th on the Empress of Japan, and were there transferred to the 'Thiala' after having been inspected by the health officer and the Immigration inspector. When the 'Thiala' arrived here on Monday night, Collector Saunders, who was in the city, entered and cleared her and then Special Agent Scoville and Inspector Lottus took charge of the Japanese. Under the Immigration law every alien coming into the United States must have at least \$10.00 of the Japanese and the five women, who formerly claimed, were their own, had the requisite sum, but the others did not. The majority allege, however, that they had no money when they left Vancouver, but had spent it in their possession, they said, at the time they were inspected by the Immigration inspector. There were only two in the party who were able to produce the money, and they told the Government officers that he had given his money to a partner and the other said it was his money, he said. The others were allowed to remain in the city, but were sent back to Victoria on the 'Thiala', which left there at midnight on Monday. The party which landed here all were dressed and several of them had a good command of the English language. The 'Thiala' had been in the United States and returned to Japan.
