T. R. MERRITT IS DEAD.

Founder and President of Imperial Bank Passes to Rest. St. Catharines, Ont., Jan. 12.-Thom-

as R. Merritt died at 2.15 yesterday

as R. Merritt died at 2.15 yesterday afternoon.
Thomas R. Merritt was born November 17, 1824, in Mayville, New York. He was the fourth son of the late Hon. William Hamilton Merritt, builder of the Welland Canal.
Deceased was reputed to be worth about two million dollars. He was president and founder of the Imperial Bank. The Imperial Bank grew out of the Niagara District Bank, of which he was 21 years president and direc-

he was 21 years president and direc He was also president of the Wel-He was also president of the weight Canal Loan Co.; president of the Security Loan & Savings Co.; president of the Niagara Falls Suspension Bridge Co.; and for many years president of the St. Catharines Gas Co. He was educated in the St. Catharines Collegiate Institute, and Upper Canada College. In 1853 he married Mary, daughter of the late Thomas Benson, who survives her husband. There were no children. In 1868 Mr. Merritt was elected member of Parlia-

Merritt was elected member of Parliament for Lincoln county, when Hon.
Mr. Benson was taken into the Senate.
In 1872 he was re-elected, but in 1874 he declined the unanimous nomination of the Conservatives.

He was for many years managing director of the Welland division of the Grand Trunk, Mr. Merritt was prominently connected with Ridley College, and held the office of president. He was a life-long member of St. Thomas Episcopal Church here.

RULE OR RUIN.


U.S. Senator Heyburn Pays His . Respects to Wall Street. Washington, D.C., Jan. 12.—Before going into executive session yesterday, the Senate listened to a speech by Mr. Heyburn in support of his bill creating a national board for the control for corporations, in which he denounced Wall street because of its alleged interference with the affairs of the country.

He said that when the "street" could not dictate the financial course of the Government it was ever ready to threaten disaster, and he pleaded for legislation that would rob it of such power for evil.

Caught After Long Chase.

Minnéapolis, Jan. 12.—After a chase, which extimated from Quebec, Canada, to the Baketas, George Ernast Sisling of Nottingham, Bagland, was arrested here last evening, charged with forgery and ambeastement. The complainant is Wm. Bagley, a lace manufacturer in Nottingham. Sisling's alleged defaleations are said to amount to a large sum, but the specific charge is that of forging a cheque for \$525. Sisling is alleged to have fied from England in 1904, with his wife.

Bears Honors For Japs.
London, Jan. 12.—Prince Arthur of Connaught, attended by Admiral Sir Edward Seymour and the other members of the Royal Commission appointed by King Edward to present the Order of the Garter to the Emperor of Japan, started yesterday for Tokio. Prince Arthur is also the bearer of these orders of merit for Admiral Togo, Field Marshal Oyama and Field Marshal Tamapala.
