Local and Other Items

At a mass meeting at Coventry, England, on July 29th, the strikers in the munition plants decided to resume work immediately.

A report from Loretville, in the mountains, a short distance from Quebec, states that an earthquake was felt in that neighborhood shortly after nine o'clock on the morning of the 27th.

A despatch from Vladivostok under date of July 25, says that Major General Nakachima has arrived there to act as Japan's military representative. General Nakachima was head of the Japanese mission to Russian headquarters.

Paris advices of the 29th state that the Italian soldiers who have been taking part in the fighting along the Marne have requested that they be allowed to stick to the task until the battle has been definitely decided.

Advices of the 28th, from Dundas, Ont., say that when the town commissioner tapped an oil car which had been rushed through in order that the town roads might be oiled, it was discovered that the car was filled with water. No explanation has been obtained as yet.

The Food Administration is informed that nearly 800,000, 000 bushels of wheat is stored in Great Britain. The Australian Government has guaranteed 83 cents per bushel and to this the Commonwealth has added 12 cents making the price 95 cents to the producer.

At the High Mass in the Cathedral on Sunday last, Father Cullen of St. Paul preached an eloquent sermon, especially advocating generous contributions towards the fund for the establishing of huts for the Catholic soldiers at the front.

On Friday last the Humphrey glass works at Moncton was totally destroyed by fire. The loss is estimated at \$14,000 with insurance of about \$10,000. The business was a practically new one and orders were coming in from all parts of Canada when the crash came. It is likely the factory will be rebuilt.

During the electrical storm on Tuesday the 23, Messrs. H. B. and Alvin Haestis of O'Leary lost two valuable cows. The St. Edward school was badly damaged. Two corner casings, with shingles were ripped off and the post split. Large patches of shingles were taken off and the school door was broken.

London advices of the 28 state that Sir Robert Borden and Hon. C. C. Ballantyne had an important conference with Admiral Norris of Manitoba, Martin of Winnipeg, First Sea Lord, and Admiral Hope. Later Premier Borden, Sir Edward Kemp and Major Gibson also attended the Imperial War Conference which concluded on the 28th.

Local And Other Items

It was officially announced in London on July 26, that Japan has decided to accept the American proposal to assist the Slovak armies in Siberia.

Mourning will be worn for four weeks by the King's Court for former Czar Nicholas of Russia according to an order issued by King George.

London advices of the 27 state that during the past week the British airmen have accounted for 76 German planes driven down, 154 tons of bombs were dropped, and 51 British machines are missing.

A few days ago when one of our stretcher-bearers were attempting to reach some wounded men they were fired on by the Germans. Evidently the huns have decided to abolish another human practice prevalent in all wars.

Premier Lloyd George announced on behalf of the government that all the men who are wilfully absent from work after the 29th will be considered to have voluntarily placed themselves outside the munitions industry and will be compelled to serve with the army.

Word comes from Paris that the French steamer Lydien has been sunk by a submarine off San Sebastian, six of the crew of forty-six have reached the shore. The Germans rammed a raft with the other members of the crew on it and left them to drown.

According to advices of the 26th a brilliant aerial performance by the Belgian ace, Lieut. Coppens, who celebrated the birthday of King Albert by destroying three German observation balloons, is told in a cable received by the Belgian Consul. 23 victorious aerial flights and 18 balloons is now his record.

According to Boston advices, Oswald Kunhardt, formerly German and Austrian Consul of that city was arrested as an enemy alien at his home in Manchester on July 24. Federal officers refused to confirm or deny a report that the arrest was connected with submarine activity off the coast.

A party consisting of three provincial Premiers and two federal Cabinet Ministers, Premiers of Manitoba, Martin of Winnipeg, and Stewart of Saskatchewan and the Hon. Arthur Borden, Minister of the Interior and J. A. Calder, Minister of Immigration and Colonization, who have been in England since May 27, arrived in Canada on July 24 and left immediately for western points.

Fourth Anniversary Of The War A PROCLAMATION CANADA, Province of Prince Edward Island.

By His Honor Augustine Colin Macdonald, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Prince Edward Island, etc., etc. etc.

WHEREAS, it is eminently desirable that Sunday, the 4th day of August next, being the Fourth Anniversary of the Declaration of the War should be fittingly and devoutly commemorated in this Province thereby emphasizing the unity of all Communities of the Empire in their unwavering determination to crown with victory the great cause for which the war was undertaken and is being fought.

I have therefore thought fit by and with the advice of His Majesty's Executive Council of this Province to order and direct that Sunday, the said fourth day of August next, be and the same is hereby set apart and declared a day of public prayer of intercession and commemoration in all the churches and places of worship in this Province and I do most heartily invite the clergy, men of every denomination and all our loyal subjects to do all in their power to make the day one worthy of the occasion.

I do also order and direct that Monday, the Fifth day of August next, from the hour of 1 o'clock p. m. be observed as a Public Holiday in this Province in order that the event may be further commemorated on that day by the formal passing of the Resolution submitted by the Imperial authorities and also by the formal opening of the Soldiers' Casualty Home, Charlottetown, and by the performance of such other public functions as may be deemed appropriate, of which all loyal and loving subjects in this Province are required to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of this Province, at Charlottetown, this twentieth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, and in the ninth year of His Majesty's reign.
