### BOLSHEVIKS ON THE MARCH.

PARIS, Dec. 14. Bolshevik troops consisting of eleven infantry divisions and cavalry and artillery are marching towards Central Europe on a front of nearly 400 miles from the Gulf of Finland to the Dnieper river, according to the despatches from Berne. The advance began on November 11, the day the German armistice was signed. German soldiers are joining the Bolsheviks who are reported to be destroying everything in their path and capturing material left behind by the Germans in their withdrawal westward. Reports from the European capitals in the last week have reported the Bolsheviki advancing through Esthonia, which lies immediately south of the Gulf of Finland.
