

KALADAR STATION, Ont-6A.P.1 -Three year old Carolyn Noreen Spencer was crushed to death and her rother Ronald, miraculously saved when the express waggon in which station platform and tossed them unier the wheels of a passing freight. Respect the Law. The Quebec Government is deter-

mined to stop speeding on the provincial highways, both in the interest of the roads and of safety. The wild speed does harm to the surface and also is responsible for the numerous accidents. Hon. Mr. Perron has time and again warned and appealed to automobile drivers to respect the laws, and the majority no doubt have given heed to the urgings. There is a minority of drivers, however, who care hothing for the regulations and who turn a deaf ear to all the appeals and warnings. These gentlemen are to be dealt with summarily, and to catch them hotfoot, as it were, a special squad of provincial motorcycle men has been appointed by the department of Hon.
