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SAD AND SUDDEN.

Mrs. Barry Falls Dead on Her Way From Church.

Stricken With Apoplexy on Richmond Street—She Lives But a Few Minutes—A Heavy Fall.

Death came in a sad and sudden manner this afternoon to Mrs. Barry, of 691 Maitland street.

Mrs. Barry had been attending the services in St. Peter's Cathedral, and had just emerged from the westerly gate and started north on Richmond street when she was seen to fall on the icy pavement. As it was a few minutes after 12 o'clock there were many on the street going to dinner, and several pedestrians ran over to pick her up. They were shocked to find her gasping and in an apparently dying condition. Willing hands carried her across the road to James Miller's residence near Morley's butcher shop. Dr. Mitchell was on the spot in a few minutes but she died before he could reach her. He expressed the opinion that a stroke of apoplexy caused her death. It may have been induced by slipping on the sidewalk in the first place, or the stroke may have been the cause of her fall. She struck the back of her head, and as she was a large heavy woman the concussion must have been severe.

Mrs. Barry was about 70 years of age, and enjoyed robust health. She was in good spirits just before her death, and remarked to a friend coming out of the Cathedral that she felt unusually bright. Deceased lived with her son Michael P. Barry, an Canadian Express messenger on the C.P.R. between London and Toronto. Another son is a miller near Dorchester, and a third is in the Western States. Her husband has been dead about twenty years. She was a very estimable woman, and her sad end will cast a gloom over her many friends. The body was removed afterwards to her late residence.

INDUSTRIOUS WOMEN.

Monthly Meeting of the W. C. T. U.—108 Members Present—A Cooking Department to be Established—An Art Exhibition.

At the regular monthly meeting of the W. C. T. U. on Tuesday afternoon there were 108 members present. A most interesting Bible reading on the beatitudes was given, seven different ladies taking part. Quarterly reports from the different departments were then heard.

The evangelistic committee reported 12 meetings held, 75 visits made and 12 families relieved. The women were urged to send second-hand clothing to Somerset Hall for the relief of the poor.

The hospital committee reported regular visits and distribution of literature, temperance and religious, and believed that their labors had been blessed with at least the conversion of one soul during the quarter.

The jail committee reported the number of prisoners to have been remarkably small, six in all, three of them old women, glad of a home for the winter. Regular meetings have been held, with distribution of literature. It was announced that the literature committee is in need of more temperance and religious newspapers, and a request was made that the friends of this work would, after having read their newspapers, send them in bundles to Somerset Hall, as good use could be made of thousands more.

The superintendent of the press department most kindly accepted temperance items for publication.

The women's franchise department reported steady work a growing interest.

The Sunday school temperance committee reported that on Dec. 18 seventeen Sabbath schools in the city were supplied with temperance speakers. They have 25 speakers on their staff and are now making arrangements for next temperance day, March 19. Also several schools have been supplied with a list of suitable temperance books for libraries.

The literature department reported having distributed 400 leaflets and 192 newspapers.

This band of hope committee reported encouraging results. The boys are greatly interested. Mr. J. W. Jones has given a medal to be presented to the boy bringing in the largest number of recruits. Mr. L. W. Keenleyside acts as secretary, and a number of ladies and gentlemen have kindly contributed in various ways to the entertainment and instruction of the band.

The superintendent of the Women's Journal asked for more subscribers to that paper. The price in clubs is only 30 cents, and it is the Canadian official organ for the W. C. T. U.

The Industrial School superintendent reported a large attendance and good work being done. It is the intention soon to branch out into a cooking department, and in order to raise funds for this purpose and increase the usefulness of the school the union is now making extensive preparations for an art loan exhibition to be held in Somerset Hall from Feb. 21 to the 25th inclusive. It is intended that this exhibition shall at least equal anything of the kind ever held in this city. A large collection of pictures from some of the first artists in Canada will be shown, including those from Africa, India, and fresh arrivals from Japan will be exhibited; cabinets full of rare and some very old china; enameled collections, and various works of art, and beautiful decorations may be expected. Refreshments on the European plan will be served guests every afternoon and evening. A beautiful candy booth is being arranged, where young ladies will daily deal out sweets manufactured on the spot. The superintendent of the Industrial School urged that all members of the union should take an interest in, and patronize this exhibit freely and bring their friends.

Eleven new members were nominated and received into full membership. At the close of this meeting a reception was held from 5 to 8 p.m. Refreshments were served in the new refreshment rooms which the ladies have just furnished. A most pleasant social time was spent, and the following ladies contributed to the enjoyment of the hour with songs, recitations and interesting little selections of different subjects.

Songs were given by Misses Boddy, Daily and Goulding; recitations by Misses Egan, Madeline, Bell and Henderson; selections by Mesdames Cameron, Heaman and Rogers.

A hearty vote of thanks was tendered to these ladies, and the meeting closed with prayer.

FROM THE CAPITAL.

Mr. Pope Will Press His Motion for Free Corn.

A Fight on the Evidence Against Caron Looked For.

Mr. Edgar Says It Will Be Damaging—Liberals to Attack Specific Duties.

(Special Editorial Correspondence by Telegram.)

OTTAWA, Feb. 15.—Regarding the attitude of the Government to tax reduction practically no changes were announced last night. Action is postponed till next session. This will have an unsettling effect on business, according to many M.P.s. Mr. Foster's policy is regarded as one of drift and "look to Washington." Not for many years has a finance minister been as much on the defensive as Mr. Foster was last night and Sir Richard Cartwright proved the fact to the hilt.

Mr. Moncrieff refused to be interviewed on the effect of the changes in the law regulating transportation of coal oil, but told me to-day that it would reduce the refiners' profit by 2 1/2 cents a gallon.

Sir Hector Langevin is on the warpath. He told me yesterday that he had important business to bring before the house, and to-day I learn that he means to move for a copy of the claims made by Messrs. N. B. McNamee & Co., contractors, in connection with the recommendations made by a set committee of the House of Commons, June, 1887, with all reports, order in Council, and other papers relating thereto. It is said that Sir Hector refused to pay as much on the defensive as Mr. Foster was last night and Sir Richard Cartwright proved the fact to the hilt.

Said Mr. J. D. Edgar this morning: "Mr. Foster may talk about demagogues, but all the demagogues cannot begin to compare with the anxiety and the restlessness that the Government has stirred up. You ask what the future policy of the Opposition will be. Well, Sir Richard Cartwright's amendment is unanimously agreed to by us, but I believe the motion for abolition of specific duties will be on with. I am going on with my motion to make cotton free, and all on our side of the House are going to press on, and in his own line. Then they will be fighting on the evidence against Caron. The Government is printing as slowly as possible, but there is some damning evidence. It does not prove all my charges, but it proves enough to show Caron in a very unfavorable light."

To-morrow Mr. Fraser, the Nova Scotia Liberal, will call the attention of the House to the conduct of Dr. Weldon and other Maritime Province members in going to the Governor-General and asking him to interfere with the law recently passed by the New Brunswick Legislature granting certificates of land to the Indians in his own line. Then they will be fighting on the evidence against Caron. The Government is printing as slowly as possible, but there is some damning evidence. It does not prove all my charges, but it proves enough to show Caron in a very unfavorable light."

The debate on the budget will be resumed to-morrow and continued from day to day till finished. It may last ten days.

Mr. Mulock will introduce a bill to extend the provisions of the Election Act to embrace bribes received in the shape of bets.

Mr. Pope (Conservative) will prosecute his motion for free corn. The Liberals have a motion to the same effect.

The oil refiners say they will dispense as much as possible with the middleman. I learn that they will establish central warehouses at various points and thus reduce the cost of getting to consumers.

I was told to-day by Mr. Cleveland (Conservative) that he was now in doubt as to whether or not he would go with his motion for abolishing any on coal oil.

It is settled that Mr. Robert Sedgwick, Deputy Minister of Justice, will be made

judge of the Supreme Court in succession to Chief Justice Ritchie, and Hugh Henry will succeed Judge McDonald on the bench of the Supreme Court of Nova Scotia.

Moynehan Re-Arrested.

Enos Moynehan was re-arrested by detective Nickle this afternoon on a peace warrant issued at the instance of Thos. Morris, who swears he is afraid of him and in danger of his life.

The Price They Paid.

It is understood that the price paid by the Cleveland syndicate for the Fraser House and property at Port Stanley was about \$13,000. Mr. Fraser, who, according to the agreement, is to be a conductor on the L. and P. S. R., asked \$28,000. The road leading up to the Fraser House from the station is owned by the railroad company, who would thus have easily shut off the approach to the hotel. This, no doubt, assisted in effecting a settlement.
