BYLAW TO PROHIBIT

EXPOSURE OF FOOD

Deputation Waited on Board of

Health in Regard to the

Matter.

The board of health, at its meeting

last night, was requested by a deputa-

tion from the Women's Canadian Club,

the Union Mothers' Club and the Council

of women to have a bylaw passed pro-

hibiting the unsanitary exposure of food

in front of stores. They also requested

that some steps be taken to insure the

establishment of a garbage system in

the city, and asked that the board of

health take steps to abolish the drinking

cup, particularly in schools.

Mrs. Yarker was the first speaker.

She stated that the Council of Women

and the other organizations were pre-

sented to protest against the way in which

food was exposed for sale in some of

the stores. It was unsanitary and in-

sanitary, and should be prohibited. Sev-

eral years ago the same request was

made, but no heed was paid to it. Mrs.

Yarker expressed the hope that the board

of health would do something.

The Dangerous Files.

Mrs. Talbot Macbeth spoke of the

horrible breeding places for flies al-

lowed to exist in the city. She thought

laws were available to prohibit such

places, and she asked the board on be-

half of the Women's Canadian Club to

assist the women in wiping out this

plague. Typhoid fever, tuberculosis and

infant mortality were most prevalent

when the flies were the most numerous.

Mrs. Macbeth suggested that a leaflet be

furnished all those registering births,

showing the best method of feeding and

caring for babies. Wherever this plan

had been adopted it had resulted in

excellent results. Mrs. Macbeth thought

that laws should be rigidly enforced to

bring the milk supply up to a higher standard,

making the product clean and whole-

some.
